 - Identify future data needs and develop the business case with support from multiple entities
 - Examples include:
 - Present on Admission
 - Payer Typology
 - Principal Language Spoken
 - Marital Status

Recent Activities

- Prepared comments on the Notice for Proposed Rulemaking for the implementation of ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS.
- Prepared comments on the Notice for Proposed Rulemaking for the implementation of the 5010 version of the HIPAA transaction standards.
- Establishing bi-directional communication between the Consortium and Data Standards/Data Content organizations.

WECCI

- Strategies for improving E coding published in the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) March 28, 2008
- Meeting of Federal agencies held in August 2008 (21 agencies attended)
- Meeting scheduled Feb 2009 with broader industry representation
 - Improve communication with stakeholders
 - Identify ways to improve E code collection
 - Improve and promote the usefulness of E code data for injury prevention
